The story of the first Father's Day in America happened in Fairmont, West Virginia on July 5, 1908. Grace Golden Clayton suggested to the minister of the local Methodist church that they hold services to celebrate fathers after a deadly mine explosion killed 361 men.

While Father's Day was celebrated locally in several communities across the country, unofficial support to make the celebration a national holiday began almost immediately. William Jennings Bryant was one of its staunchest proponents. In 1924, President Calvin Coolidge recommended that Father's Day become a national holiday. But no official action was taken.

In 1966, Lyndon B. Johnson, through an executive order, designated the third Sunday in June as the official day to celebrate Father's Day. However, it wasn't until 1972, during the Nixon administration, that Father's Day was officially recognized as a national holiday.

# When the Fishing Isn't Easy? June 14, 2022

A story is told of a young girl with a severe physical handicap, who wanted to go fishing with her dad. She begged him to take her fishing. One day, dad relented and set up a fishing date. He confided in a couple of buddies about the excursion, and his daughter's condition. One co-worker offered an alternative, "Why don't you go to the fish farm. It's handicap accessible, and within a few minutes your daughter can catch a large fish, have it cleaned and ready for supper." It sounded like a great idea. Quick, easy, effortless.

When the idea was presented, the girl simply stated, "Daddy, those fish will be caught anyway. What's so rewarding about that?" She did have a point.

On the appointed date, father steeled himself for an arduous trek. He helped her along the path until that was no longer possible. Then he carried his daughter, lunchbox, and fishing gear, through the woods to the lake. After lunch, the duo baited hooks and fished. For four hours they caught nothing. As they packed up to return to the car, the girl beamed with delight, "It was worth it dad! We'll have better luck next time."

Christians can learn from that girl. Jesus has called us to be "fishers of men." He knows we feel spiritually inadequate, maybe even handicapped, to take the gospel message. Others may encourage us to go to people who are already receptive. Quick, easy, effortless. Why put in extra work where there is no guarantee of success?

Jesus wants us to be eager to go fishing, regardless of our inadequacies or the difficulty in reaching the fishing area. He promises to guide us and carry us when we lose strength. All he asks is that we do our best, and leave the success to Him. Don't stop fishing for men with the gospel of peace, even when the fishing isn't easy.
