Lavish Love 3/28/2023

1 John 3:1 – How great is the love the Father has lavished on us, that we should be called children of God! And that is what we are!

A sinful woman braved the crowds and their derision so that she could kneel before Jesus. She had heard Jesus was in town, eating at a banquet hosted by Simon the Pharisee. This might be her only chance. She gently picked up an alabaster jar of perfume. As she touched the translucent container, she was ashamed of the circumstances that surrounded how she came to own something so valuable. Maybe, just maybe, if she presented the jar to Jesus, she could barter with him and buy forgiveness of her sins. Would Jesus ridicule her? It was a chance she had to take. 
