
BABY BOTTLE BLESSINGS







I stood on the rim of the Grand Canyon and did what millions of tourists do. I yelled, "Hello!" and listened for my echo. The speed of sound is Mach 1, or a little more than 741 MPH. Depending on distance, wind, sound wavelength, and several other variables, the time it takes for the sound to return varies. What doesn't vary is the content of the echo. An echo will always repeat the original message.

As kids we played the "echo game." One person would talk and the other would repeat everything they said exactly. The game often ended when the original talker said so many words the repeater couldn't remember them all. Or, the original talker fell silent. Or, the original talker said something like, "Hit me in the arm." When the echo repeated the same words, the talker

would oblige. About then mom would tell us to stop pestering each other or dad would threaten to turn the car around.

Studies have demonstrated that children are often echoes of their parents. If a child receives praise they tend to give praise. If they are spoken to angrily or harshly, they echo that negativity. Oh, if only we could break the pattern of echoing negativity. Peter offers a better way. 1 Peter 3:9 – "Do not repay evil with evil or insult with insult. On the contrary, repay evil with blessing,"

When someone is lashing out at you don't be their echo. Rather, return their harsh words with a blessing. Return their anger with love. Return their hatred with kindness. Return good for evil. In so doing, we live as an echo of God, our heavenly father.

Granted, it isn't natural. Nature urges us to exact revenge. You hurt me --- I hurt you. Don't be an echo for evil. Speak Godliness into a world that is screaming Godlessness.
