Learning a Lesson from Admiral Byrd 6/20/2023

In 1934, Admiral Richard E. Byrd, a decorated naval officer and explorer, participated in his second expedition to Antarctica. Byrd spent five winter months alone, monitoring a meteorological station, Advance Base. Byrd even wrote an autobiography about his experience entitled, *Alone*. Some of his radio transmissions began to concern men at the base camp, and they sent a rescue team to Advance Base. They found Byrd in very poor health because of carbon monoxide poisoning. It seems the stove pipes were not ventilating properly, due to the volume of snow.

Byrd retells that, because of the daily snow, he had to shovel to the surface just to get some exercise and clear the snow from the stove pipe. One venture found Byrd a bit too far from his hut and, because of snow and wind, unable to locate the stove pipe. Instead of panicking, Byrd drove a spike in the ice and, using a rope as a guide, walked a circle around it keeping his focus on the spike. Not finding the hut, he lengthened the distance and tried again. Finally, after the fourth attempt he found the tunnel to his hut and was safe. Rather than wandering aimlessly Byrd relied on something sure and unchanging to find his way home.

It is the same in our spiritual life. We can wander aimlessly through Bible reading, church attendance, leaning into the latest Christian trend, worship movement or exciting inspiration, trying to find something solid on which to base our faith. Or, we can focus on Jesus, and believe that our way to our eternal home is only found in Him.

Hebrews 12:2 – Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.
