The Root Is Still There 7/25/2023

Any serious landscaper, gardener or person who loves their flower beds, knows that it is a lot of work keeping ahead of the weeds. At the parsonage, we have a small flower bed with a few varieties of perennials which faithfully come up and bloom every year. Mixed in with one of the ground cover flowers is another plant that also comes up every year. It is a dandelion. It is located in a place where I think I would damage the flowers if I were to try to dig deep enough to get the weed's whole root. And putting weed killer on it will likely kill the flowers, too. So, I keep pulling off the leaves and dandelion buds, knowing full well the root is still there, and the weed will sprout up again in no time.

This exercise led me to a spiritual reality. Paul prayed that the believers in Ephesus would have power, together with the saints, to grasp the 3-Dimensional love of Christ. To do that, the faithful needed to be "rooted and established in love" (Ephesians 4:14-19). Of course, Satan despises anyone wanting to be rooted in God's love. So, he tries to uproot that flower. For those whose roots in God's love go deep, it doesn't matter what leaves or buds Satan snatches from the surface, the root is still there. God's love will sprout up again in no time.

Satan never stops trying to destroy God's love being displayed by God's children. Like he did with Job, he isn't shy about taking everything away from us. BUT, if the root of God's love is still there, we have hope. A Christian's hope isn't in the dreams and wishes of the world. Our hope is in the promises of our eternally faithful God. Stay rooted in His love.
