## Hand of Thanksgiving 11/14/2023

I read a story about a 2<sup>nd</sup> grade teacher who gave her students the homework of drawing a picture of something for which they were thankful. The next day, the students brought back their artwork. The teacher promised to hang the drawings on the classroom wall while the kids were at recess. The students had mostly drawn things the teacher expected. There were pictures of family, friends, pets, food, toys, houses, etc. Then the teacher noticed Harold's picture. It was a picture of a hand. Harold hadn't traced his own hand. This hand was larger. There were no words to identify the hand. So, whose hand was it?

As the students came in from recess, they looked at the pictures. When they saw Harold's drawing, they wondered whose hand it was, too. One child concluded it was the hand of God, who gives us everything we need. Another thought it was a farmer's hand, because they grow our food. Another said it was a policeman's hand, because they protect us. Finally, Harold came into the classroom and the teacher asked him if he wanted to share whose hand it was.
