

Why We Care for One Another 10/8/2024

"Not another hurricane!" It seems the storms just keep coming. So, I "Googled," "Are hurricanes more frequent now?" The answer I got from multiple sources was, "No." Apparently since satellite tracking began in 1980, the average number of storms hasn't risen. The intensity of the storms has increased. So far in 2024, we have had 10 named storms, six became hurricanes and two are major hurricanes. Experts are telling us to prepare for two or three more major hurricanes before the season is over. The devastation from Helene is still being calculated. 220 people are dead with about as many still unaccounted for. The damage is in the billions of dollars. And now, hurricane Milton is headed for the Florida peninsula, with more death and devastation expected.

Millions of generous people are sending money, truckloads of supplies, temporary shelters and doing whatever they can to help those struggling. Ever wonder why? Why do we feel compelled to assist our fellow man? If all we are is the product of evolution, why should we care what disasters befall others? Evolution requires that the process of "natural selection" occur. There should be no grief for those suffering. Except, we aren't a product of evolution. God put within us compassion and morality. We hurt when others hurt, and want assist complete strangers because we feel a moral obligation to do so.

Why wait until there is a crisis to become a better representation of who God wants us to be? Paul teaches, **1 Corinthians 12:24b-26...** God has combined the members of the body and has given greater honor to the parts that lacked it, so that there should be no division in the body, but that its parts should have equal concern for each other. If one part suffers, every part suffers with it; if one part is honored, every part rejoices with it.
