# Deciding to End the Feud 11/5/2024

Have you ever fought like the *Hatfields and the McCoys?* That phrase has come to represent any two factions that just cannot seem to come to a place of understanding, peace and reconciliation.

The online encyclopedia, *Wikipedia*, offers a detailed description of the feud that began during the Civil War (1863). The McCoy family lived primarily on the Kentucky side of the Tug Fork of the Big Sandy River; the Hatfields lived mostly on the West Virginia side. Some were Union sympathizers, and others sided with the Confederacy. The war fueled hatred between neighbors, which led the families to distrust and kill. The anger didn't subside with the end of the war. There were more killings, a pig snatching, kidnappings, bootlegging arrests, a Hatfield/McCoy romance that ended in bloodshed and a New Year's Night Massacre in 1888. It took 140 years before the families decided to end the feud.

**Wikipedia** -- On June 14, 2003, in Pikeville, Kentucky, the McCoy cousins partnered with Reo Hatfield of Waynesboro, Virginia, to declare an official truce between the families. Reo Hatfield said that he wanted to show that if the two families could reach an accord, others could also. He had said that he wanted to send a broader message to the world that when national security is at risk, Americans put their differences aside and stand united: "We're not saying you don't have to fight, because sometimes you do have to fight," he said. "But you don't have to fight forever." Signed by more than sixty descendants during the fourth Hatfield–McCoy Festival, the truce was touted as a proclamation of peace, saying "We ask by God's grace and love that we be forever remembered as those that bound together the hearts of two families to form a family of freedom in America."

You may not think peace or reconciliation can happen in your circumstance. Don't wait 140 years. It takes a humble spirit and a willingness to listen to God speak into your hate-filled soul. Are you listening?
