"A Holy Lament" 5/13/2025

The book of Psalms is a compilation of five books of poems that were likely set to music and sung in the temple worship. Many of the 150 psalms are songs of adoration, praise and declarations of God's unfailing love and faithfulness. In many ways this "psalter" is like the song books used in worship in modern churches.

What is interesting is that more than 1/3 of the psalms are known as songs of lament. Meaning they describe corporate and individual grief, pain, suffering and feelings of alienation from God. The songs expose personal struggles with guilt, anger, frustration, and disappointment both with God and with other humans. These types of songs are conspicuously absent from modern worship volumes. Maybe we don't sing laments because we don't want to relive our weaknesses, sins, and adversity.

Yet, we all sin. We all doubt. We all go through times of weakness and disappointment. A lament encourages us to face our pain and wrestle with the guilt of our sin. A lament reminds us of our inadequacy in handling life's experiences. It forces us to appeal to God for His power and authority, rather than trying to figure it out on our own. A lament pushes us into the throne room of God where we must humble ourselves before His grace, faithfulness, mercy and compassion.

Some lamentations in Psalms express concern that God had abandoned His people. We can all relate. This means that laments unify us with song writers of ancient days. Plus, they unify us with Jesus who, while dving on the cross, lamented to feeling abandoned by His father, God.

Maybe it is time to rediscover the value of the songs of lament. Joy and praise have their place in exulting God. So should our expressions of sorrow, regret and pain. God can handle our laments.
